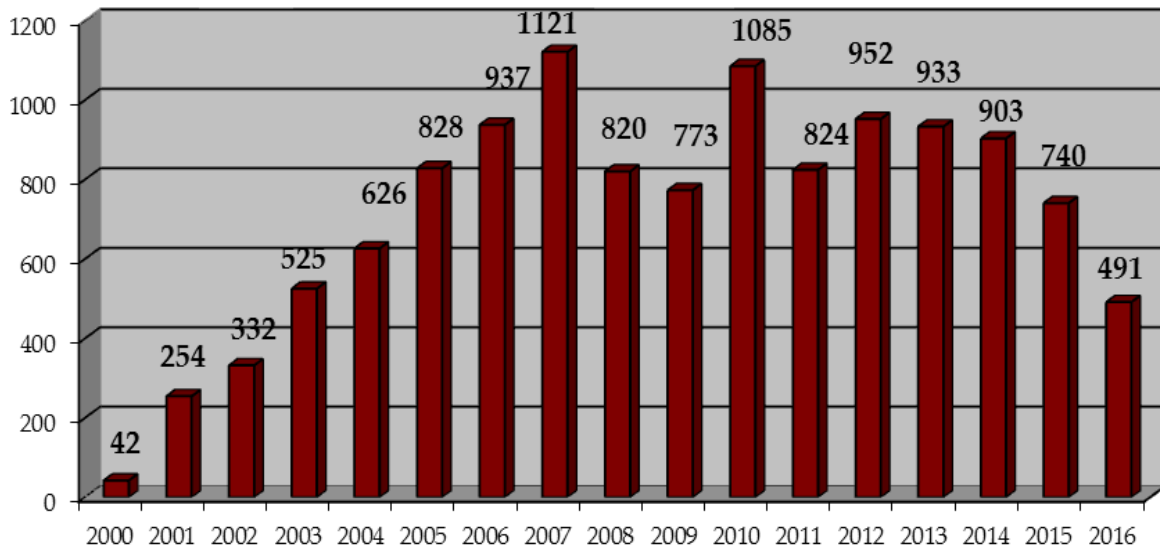


## COMBATING TRAFFICKING IN HUMAN BEINGS IN UKRAINE

Statistics updated on 30 June 2016

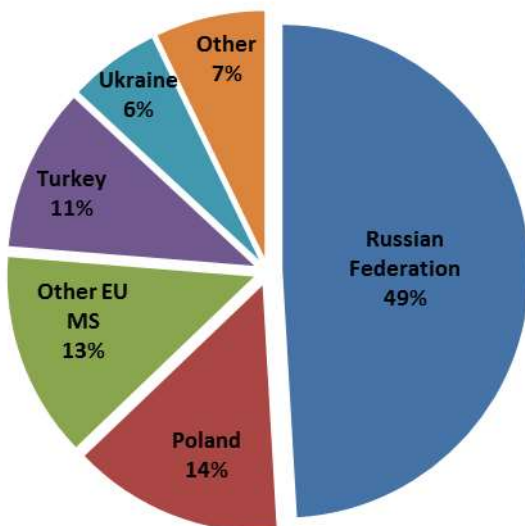
IOM Ukraine has been assisting victims of trafficking (VoTs) since 2000. From January 2000 to June 2016, **12,186 VoTs** received comprehensive reintegration assistance, which included legal aid, medical care, psychological counseling, financial support, vocational training, and other types of assistance based on individual needs.

### 1. Number of identified VoTs (2000 – Jun 2016)

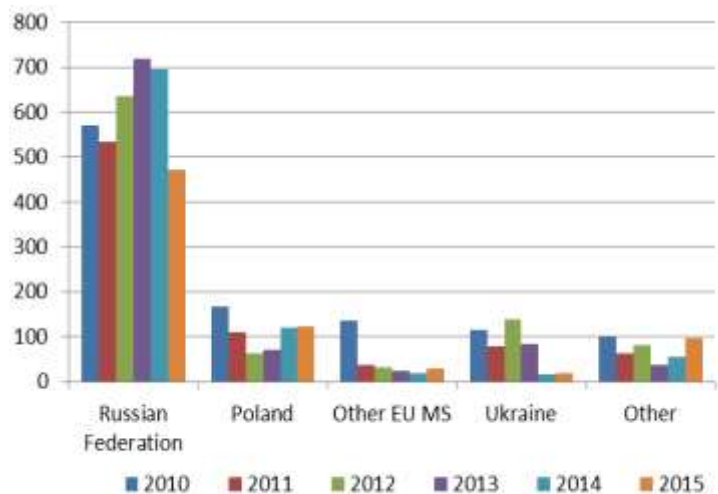

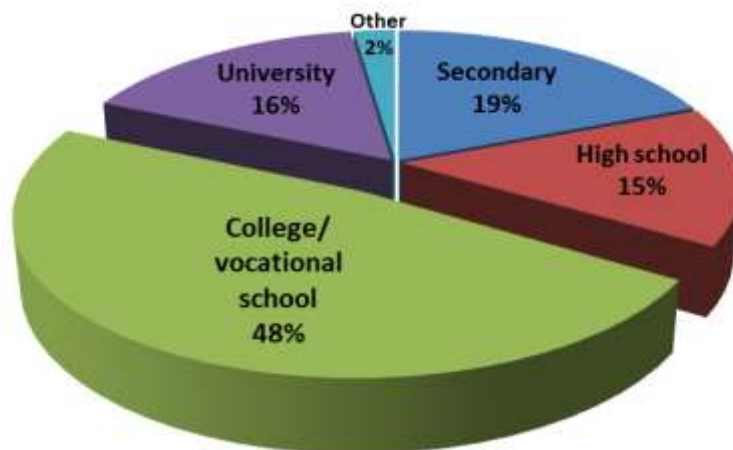
